



Answering iGCSE Questions – Paper 1, Question D



Question (D) will ask you to use a source and your own knowledge to describe or explain ***cause, effect or change***. If it is about change, you must show change either by comparing the situation before and after the development, or you must show how it developed during the period. This is worth 10 marks, so spend about 12 minutes.

1. **Use the Source** - Ensure that you refer directly to the source in your answer.
2. **Own Knowledge** - Use the source to stimulate your own knowledge by underlining key names, events or dates in the source. Once you explain these in more detail, you are using your own knowledge.
3. Two paragraphs or explanations are enough to get A*.
4. Must make links between each factor to get highest marks. Explain how one reason led to the next.

The Source	Underline key words, events, and people in the source that you can write more about.
First Reason	Give the first factor mentioned in the source. Fully explain it.
Link	Make a link with the 2 nd factor.
Second Reason	Fully explain the second factor.
Conclusion	Sum up the two factors, stressing the links between them.
